About Summer Scholars

The Fordham University Summer Scholars Program was established in 2006 in collaboration between Fordham University and BronxWorks. Sponsored by The Teagle Foundation, the program aim is to support local high school students by challenging them to strive for academic excellence. The five-week summer enrichment program encourages and challenges High School age students to complete college level history research beyond the textbook. Through this program, students will spend time on campus, explore various historical sites throughout New York City, meet and converse with college professors, college students, administrators and faculty. Through the History Makers program students develop research projects; prepare presentations, practice writing skills and complete college level reading assignments.

Location

Fordham University's Rose Hill Campus.

Program

The content of the program focuses upon the African American Experience as it pertains to the History of New York City with a special emphasis on the Bronx. The program introduces history through a different lens, using oral history, field research and mentorship. Participants will develop critical thinking skills and will examine events and experiences through diverse perspectives. Summer Scholars research facts and knowledge often ignored and left out of mainstream history. Student's complete research and work to establish a culmination of information and facts into a final presentations, dedicated to uncovering the cultural, political, economic, and religious histories of the more than 500,000 people of African descent in the Bronx.

Eligibility

To qualify, applicant must:

- Be a high school student with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better
- Academically in good standing

*Note: Students required to take Summer School will not be accepted

Essay Question

Write an essay on the following topic. Your essay must be no less than (2) and no more than (4) typed, double-spaced pages.

*Essays are judged on content, clarity, writing style, organization, grammar, and critical thinking skills.

Please indicate a person historically that has had a significant influence on our society and describe that influence? How do you feel they have impacted your community; and what legacy have they left behind; and why the individual is important to you.
