









Welcome!


Selection Criteria

The information used to evaluate applicants for admission to programs that screen and rank applicants for admission.

For this year, can include

- Final core course grades from the 2018-2019 school year
- Core course grades through February 2020 from the 2019-2020 school year
- State test scores from the 2018-2019 school year

Some programs use additional criteria. Attendance and punctuality **WILL NOT** be used for admissions

Offers

New for 2021 Applicants' academic record will not be used for admission to audition programs. Offers will be made based on the strength of students' auditions



Screened admissions method

What to do

- List the program on your application
- Check the program's Selection Criteria section in MySchools to learn about any additional requirements

Offers

- Based on each program's selection criteria, each applicant is given a composite score and then ranked.
- Offers are made in priority group order, and then in order by ranked numbers.



Educational Option (Ed. Opt.) admissions method


Creates academic diversity among incoming students.

What to do

List the program on your application

Offers

- Each student receives composite score based on course grades and test scores from the 2018-2019 school year and course grades through February 2020 of last year.
- Based on their score, students are assigned a category (high, middle, low).
- Offers are made by category

Why 12 program choices?

97% of students who listed 12 programs got an offer from their application!

Preference Order of Programs

List programs in your true order of preference, starting with your top choice as #1.



High schools CANNOT see the order you place programs on your application.




You will be considered for your first choice first. If you don't get an offer to your first choice, then you are considered for your second choice as if it were your new first choice.
