



# COVID-19 Regents Cancellation: What does that mean for me?

# June Regents are Cancelled and Exams are Waived

NYSED and the Board of Regents have cancelled the June 2020 Regents exams. There are 3 scenarios where this exemption applies.

Although the Regents exams have been cancelled, juniors must still complete their required coursework in order to receive credits towards promotion to 12th grade.

Students who intended to take any June 2020 Regents may be eligible for a June 2020 Regents exemption. This exemption applies to:

1

Any student currently enrolled in a course that culminates in a June Regents exam, and who will have passed the course.

If you pass your Regents class, you will be exempt for your Regents.

2

Any student who fails the Regents course at the end of the school year and makes up the course in summer school will be granted Regents exemption in August 2020.

3

Any student who previously passed a Regents course, but has not yet passed the associated Regents exam and was intending to take the test in June by sitting in AIS to achieve a passing score.



## What does this mean?

1. A Regents exemption due to COVID-19 will count towards a Regents Diploma.
2. If you are in Algebra 2 and/or World Language 3 class and pass the course, you will get a Regents exemption due to COVID-19 and be granted eligibility for an Advanced Regents Diploma.



# Lab Requirements for Science Classes

Students do not need to complete 1,200 minutes of satisfactory laboratory experiences in order to be exempted from a Science Regents Exam. This means that all you need to be exempt from a Science Regents Exam is to pass the course (Living Environment, Earth Science, Chemistry, Physics).



## AP Exams

The College Board has announced that AP exams will not be administered in school buildings, but students will be able to take AP exams at home. You must sit for these exams if you are in the course.



## What does this mean?

1. You must pass your classes.
2. Promotion Requirements: 33 Credits

Focus on English 11, US History, Total 6 Science Credits, Total 6 Math Credits, Total 3 Phys Ed Credits, Total 5 Elective Credits.
